

John Chrysostom A Simple Google Search



I was sitting at my office desk one day with my laptop open in front of me and Google searched "John Chrysostom on hoarding wealth." Here is what came up.

John Chrysostom vehemently condemned the hoarding of wealth, arguing that excess possessions belong to the poor and that hoarding is a theft from those in need. He emphasized that true wealth lies not in abundance but in contentment, and the wealthy are spiritually bankrupt if they hoard their resources rather than using them to serve Christ in the poor. Chrysostom advocated for a change of heart to achieve true justice, **not forced redistribution**, as a means of sharing wealth and fulfilling one's duty as a steward of God's gifts.

Key Points from John Chrysostom on Hoarding Wealth

Theft from the Poor:

Chrysostom stated that "not to share our own wealth with the poor is theft from the poor and deprivation of their means of life". He believed that excess wealth was not truly owned by the rich but was entrusted to them for the benefit of others.

True Wealth vs. False Wealth:

He defined the truly wealthy person as someone who "does not need many possessions," while the truly poor person is someone who "requires many things". Hoarding was seen as a sign of spiritual poverty, leading one away from true freedom and contentment in God.

• Stewardship, Not Ownership:

Wealth is a gift from God and should be viewed as a form of responsible stewardship, not personal property. Failure to use wealth for the good of others, especially the poor, is a betrayal of this trust.

• Condemnation of Luxurious Living:

Through his homilies on the story of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-30), Chrysostom condemned the luxurious living of the rich who neglected the suffering poor.

Moral Transformation is Key:

He believed that true justice and the equitable distribution of wealth could only come from a fundamental change of heart, **not from forced measures like government redistribution**.

• An Opportunity for God:

Instead of hoarding, the wealthy should use their resources to "nourish Christ in poverty here" by caring for the needy, thereby laying up great profit for the future.


2025 Ministry Awards Recipient
